

Delta SkyMiles no longer expire

Delta SkyMiles users have reason to cheer, and travel more frequently.

Atlanta-based **Delta Air Lines Inc.**, the second busiest carrier at Raleigh-Durham International Airport, said Tuesday it canned the SkyMiles mileage expiration for all accounts as of Jan. 1, making it the only major U.S. carrier without mileage expiration.

Previously, miles expired 24 months after a member's last qualifying mileage activity, which required a member to earn or redeem miles within that period.

Last year, frequent flyers redeemed more than 264 billion miles in the SkyMiles program for more than 12 million award redemptions. In 2010, 8.3 percent of revenue miles flown on Delta (NYSE: DAL) were for award travel.

Delta gives \$313M in profit sharing

Delta Air Lines Inc. (NYSE: DAL) is rewarding its employees with \$313 million in profit sharing following a \$593 million profit in 2010.

Richard Anderson, CEO of the Atlanta-based airline, sent a memo to employees on Feb. 14 to detail the profit sharing. The memo follows:

To: Delta Colleagues Worldwide

From: Richard Anderson

Subject: Sharing our success every step of the way

Congratulations and thank you! Today Delta is paying out \$313 million in profit sharing – a direct result of your hard work and dedication that enabled Delta to record a \$1.4 billion profit for 2010 [Editorial note: before charges]. We continue to deliver on our commitment to share Delta's successes with those who make it possible.

Profit sharing is not a one-time payout. Instead, it is part of your total compensation that includes a competitive package of pay, benefits and work rules along with additional opportunities to earn more when the company performs well. This year's profit sharing continues the momentum that we've gained during the last four years, enabling continued investments in our people:

Coming out of bankruptcy in 2007, Delta employees received \$1 billion in incentives and improved compensation and benefit programs.

For our strong financial performance in 2007, employees earned \$158 million in profit sharing. As a testament to the airline we would build together, Delta employees were granted 15% equity in the combined company following the close of the merger in 2008, valued at approximately \$900 million at the time of distribution.

For solid operational performance in 2009, Delta people earned approximately \$66 million through monthly operational performance bonuses.

For three consecutive years, Delta increased base pay for frontline people, making good on a premerger promise to bring Delta base pay rates to industry-standard by the end of 2010.

And today, as a direct reflection of your hard work and our merger's success, we are sharing the largest profit sharing payout in our airline's history.

10 Airline Stocks: Factors That Could Keep a Lid on Any Upside for These Companies

February 18, 2011

With rising fuel prices already in motion and rising labor inputs just over the horizon for airlines, we've identified good candidates for a potential short. The industry is likely to undergo further consolidation, and as a consequence, ticket prices should continue to firm. We think these risks are outweighed by the unprofitability that plagues this cyclical sector. High speed rail projects, spillover risk from unrest overseas, and burdensome security procedures prior to boarding should keep a lid on the upside for most airlines.

Within the individual airline companies, here is what we found:

Alaska Air Group (ALK): This airline has a 20% market share of the coveted Alaskan area market. We expect the company to continue to destroy capital for shareholders, however, with margins closer to 7% and capital spending eating up 10% of revenues over the next several years. Revenue growth will remain in the mid-single digits as more travelers seek Alaska as a favorite getaway destination. We think shares are worth \$15 apiece.

UPDATE 2007 TAX RETURN RECLASSIFICATION

We've got some more good news on the 2007 Amended Tax Return battle with DAL/IRS. A third pilot (Eli Chen – LAX) received a refund check back from the IRS. Eli was one of the

first pilots to submit a 2007 Amended Return through Bill Whalen (my accountant). Eli received no audit. He also approved my using his name.

This is exciting to us because we believe the more pilots that get a refund back from the IRS, the better the chances all pilots can get the same results.

It should be pointed out that Eli Chen is a Nevada resident. All three of us that have won have been Nevada residents. Bill Whalen, my accountant, has the potential to get cases that go through him transferred to the Nevada IRS offices if there is an IRS disagreement or audit even if originally filed in another IRS jurisdiction.

Remaining financial items for retirees to watch:

After Aug 2007 these are retirement items remaining with financial consequence.

- 1. PBGC 2nd look re-calc at qualified annuity benefits completed 8/24/07
- 2. PBGC make up lump payment for underpayments since termination: most reported received 1/31/08
- 3. Final claim distribution by DAL through BSI pending (now likely by Mar 31,2011 according Delta Docket) Keep checking your account for more DAL shares.
- 4. Class Action suit against DAL concerning 5 yr look-back worth in excess of \$100 million withdrawn
- 5. Final Benefit Determination Letters (BDL's) PBGC re-calc "determination" of qualified annuity (likely after claim stock sale) *in process until end of year* (only 45 days to appeal) Appeal extensions generally granted in Nov 2010 now extended by our law firm for all to: revised to Feb 18, 2011 Now Mar 18, 2011, April 29, 2011
- 6. Pension reinstatement/contribution request by DP3 representing the retired pilots. very long shot....pending
- 7. Roth IRA creation as per Worker, Retiree, and Employer Recovery Act of 2008 deadline June 22nd, 2009

- 8. Expiration of HCTC 80% premium subsidy will expire on December 31, 2010. Back to 65% unless legislative action. Action has continued 80% for Jan & Feb.
- 9. Financial condition of the D&S Plan--a plan that pays benefits to eligible survivors of deceased pilots as well as to disabled pilots. A form 5500 for the D&S Plan is filed annually.
- 10. Formation of a VEBA Health Insurance plan by DP3.

DP3 Benefit Calculator

We are pleased to announce that DP3 has created an on line calculator that will assist many of you in assessing whether there are <u>calculation errors</u> in your current PBGC benefit.....

Please note that we are not actuaries or attorneys. Therefore any values generated by this calculator may not accurately represent either your current benefit or any future benefit. The calculator is intended as an aid in illuminating the possibility of calculation or data errors and possible benefits of appealing PBGC procedures.

This calculator only works for retirees who were hired after February 1, 1972 and retired after June 30, 2002. This is approximately 2500 of the 3500 retirees most negatively impacted by PBGC procedures.

TEXT OF AMENDMENTS -- (Senate - February 03, 2011)

[Page: S553] GPO's PDF

SEC. X. ROLLOVER OF AMOUNTS RECEIVED IN AIRLINE CARRIER BANKRUPTCY.

- (a) General Rules .--
- (1) **ROLLOVER OF AIRLINE PAYMENT AMOUNT**.--If a qualified airline employee receives any airline payment amount and transfers any portion of such amount to a traditional IRA within 180 days of receipt of such amount (or, if later, within 180 days of the date of the enactment of this Act), then such amount (to the extent so transferred) shall be treated as a rollover contribution described in section 402(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. A qualified airline employee making such a transfer may exclude from gross income the amount transferred, in the taxable year in which the airline payment amount was paid to the qualified airline employee by the commercial passenger airline carrier.
- (2) TRANSFER OF AMOUNTS ATTRIBUTABLE TO AIRLINE PAYMENT AMOUNT FOLLOWING ROLLOVER TO ROTH IRA.--A qualified airline employee who has contributed an airline payment amount to a Roth IRA that is treated as a qualified rollover contribution pursuant to section 125 of the Worker, Retiree, and Employer Recovery Act of 2008, may transfer to a traditional IRA, in a trustee-to-trustee transfer, all or any part of the contribution (together with any net income allocable to such contribution), and the transfer to the traditional IRA will be deemed to have been made at the time of the rollover to the Roth IRA, if such transfer is made within 180 days of the date of the enactment of this Act. A qualified airline employee making such a transfer may exclude from gross income the airline payment amount previously rolled over to the Roth IRA, to the extent an amount attributable to the previous rollover was transferred to a traditional IRA, in the taxable year in which the airline payment amount was paid to the qualified airline employee by the commercial passenger airline carrier. No amount so transferred to a traditional IRA may be treated as a qualified rollover contribution with respect to a Roth IRA within the 5-taxable year period beginning with the taxable year in which such transfer was made.
- (3) **EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE CLAIM FOR REFUND**.--A qualified airline employee who excludes an amount from gross income in a prior taxable year under paragraph (1) or (2) may reflect such exclusion in a claim for refund filed within the period of limitation under section 6511(a) (or, if later, April 15, 2012).
- (b) Treatment of Airline Payment Amounts and Transfers for Employment Taxes.--For purposes of chapter 21 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and section 209 of the Social Security Act, an airline payment amount shall not fail to be treated as a payment of wages by the commercial passenger airline carrier to the qualified airline employee in the taxable year of payment because such amount is excluded from the qualified airline employee's gross income under subsection (a).
- (c) Definitions and Special Rules.--For purposes of this section--
- (1) AIRLINE PAYMENT AMOUNT .--

- (A) IN GENERAL.--The term ``airline payment amount" means any payment of any money or other property which is payable by a commercial passenger airline carrier to a qualified airline employee--(i) under the approval of an order of a Federal bankruptcy court in a case filed after September 11, 2001, and before January 1, 2007, and
- (ii) in respect of the qualified airline employee's interest in a bankruptcy claim against the carrier, any note of the carrier (or amount paid in lieu of a note being issued), or any other fixed obligation of the carrier to pay a lump sum amount.

The amount of such payment shall be determined without regard to any requirement to deduct and withhold tax from such payment under sections 3102(a) and 3402(a).

- (B) **EXCEPTION**.--An airline payment amount shall not include any amount payable on the basis of the carrier's future earnings or profits.
- (2) **QUALIFIED AIRLINE EMPLOYEE**.--The term "qualified airline employee" means an employee or former employee of a commercial passenger airline carrier who was a participant in a defined benefit plan maintained by the carrier which--
- (A) is a plan described in section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 which includes a trust exempt from tax under section 501(a) of such Code, and
- (B) was terminated or became subject to the restrictions contained in paragraphs (2) and (3) of section 402(b) of the Pension Protection Act of 2006. [Page: S556] GPO's PDF
